ITEM No.: 42-BOS-1 PROPOSAL OF CHAIRMAN, CAREER AND CURRICULUM GUIDANCE COMMITTEE

(a) Proposed B.Tech Curriculum Structure.

BOS Resolution	Resolution of the Senate
The Chairperson of the Career and Curriculum Guidance Committee briefed about the salient features of the curriculum designed in line with NEP 2020. The proposed curriculum emphasizes practice-oriented education that will provide more placement opportunities for the students. One of the external BOS members, Prof. Deepthi P.P., from NIT Calicut, appreciated the new practice-oriented curriculum structure. She welcomed the flexibility given to the departments in choosing the departmental and open electives. The concerns and opinions raised by the departments are as follows. Civil Engineering: The department raised concerns in the reduction of core courses in the sixth semester. The department also suggested that flexibility may be given to register for core courses in the later semesters.	In the Senate it was discussed in detail about proposed curriculum. The Chairperson of the Career and Curriculum Guidance Committee appraised the Senate members about the need for the modified curriculum. He conveyed that the new curriculum will enhance the career prospects of the students in line with the mandate of NEP. The institute alumni as well as the experience from CDC suggests that further professional training is required for our students to secure employment. The envisaged curriculum with a prescribed

Chemical Engineering: The HOD conveyed that the credits for project/ internship [27 credits] is very high. A significant amount of time and resources are required to complete a nine-credit project. It was suggested to give flexibility to the departments to modify the project credits and to redistribute the credits to the core courses. Electronics & Communication Engineering: The department also expressed their concerns about the reduced number of core courses. The department highlighted that the number of credits for core courses came down to 48 from 75 credits in the previous version. Electrical & Electronics Engineering: The HOD suggested that instead of reducing the core credits, the total number of credits may be raised to 160 as the NEP mandates an ideal total number of credits between 150 and 160. Mechanical Engineering: The HOD conveyed that the department is flexible to adopt the new curriculum structure. Metallurgical & Materials Engineering: The department suggested that the number of core courses should be increased, and 27 credits allotted for projects/ internships are very high. The department also suggested that the duration of the lab courses can be three hours. The department is flexible to adopt the new curriculum structure. Mining Engineering: The department raised their concerns about the higher credits for projects. The HOD conveyed that the department should teach a certain number of core courses for the program. It was suggested to give flexibility to the departments to modify the project credits and redistribute the credits to the core courses. The department is flexible to adopt the new curriculum structure. Information Technology: The department suggested to increase the number of core courses in the 3rd, 4th, and 5th semesters. The theory to lab credits distribution should be decided by the department. The departments should be able to decide the range of credits for projects/ internships. Computer Science and Engineering: The HOD conveyed that the percentage of credits for theory, lab and electives came down significantly and the credits percentage for internships and projects became significantly higher. The department also expressed their concern that the students may find it difficult to complete the minor courses and internships together. Chemistry: The department accepted the revised framework. Physics: The department accepted the revised framework.	credits of 150 emphasizes internships/ projects from sixth semester onwards. The Senate members expressed their concerns about the decrease in number of core courses and the higher number of credits given to co-curricular activities. Many questions were also raised about the flexibility of the curriculum. The Chairperson-CCGC responded to the concerns raised by the Senators. It was informed that students pursuing Honors or Minor degrees will take additional 15 credits, thereby totalling 165 credits for B.Tech plus Honors, or for B.Tech plus Minors degree. The 1st and 2nd semester courses will be common for all the Engineering branches. The departments have the flexibility to modify the 3rd, 4th and 5th Semester curriculum by keeping the theory to practical credits ratio as 3:2. The course professional communication will be a part of the co-curricular activities. It was also suggested to rephrase the word co-curricular activities. The course Introduction to Engineering will be jointly taught by all Engineering departments. All the internships should be routed through the CDC. It was also decided that the students should decide their internships before the course drop dates. A SoP should be formulated for the cases that involve multiple offers of job/ internships. The Senate approved the resolution of the BOS to accord in-principal approval for the new curriculum structure. The departments are required to redesign their curriculum in accordance with the
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Mathematics: The department conveyed that the number of credits to be taught by the department has significantly reduced. It was also suggested to reduce the credits for the project from 9 to 3. The department also raised their concerns about 25 credits assigned to co-curricular activities. School of Humanities, Social Sciences & Management: The department conveyed their concerns about the professional communication, ethics and management courses. Water Resources & Ocean Engineering: The department raised their concerns about the reduced core and elective courses. The HOD expressed that the student may face difficulties in preparing for national level examinations such as GATE, Engineering Services exam and other UPSC examinations. The Chairperson, Curriculum committee addressed the concerns of the departments. He conveyed that the departments have the freedom to decide the core and elective course distribution. The BOS recommended the curriculum framework for in principle approval. The curriculum may be suitably modified with the inputs from the departments.	approved framework and share the final structure and list of courses for approval.
